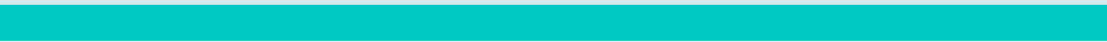

Highlights from 2023!

Feel the Beat (ages 3 to 5): "Feel the Beat" is our dynamic preschool program designed to provide a supportive and enriching environment for children with Autism. Our 3-week program was facilitated in collaboration with Mercyhurst Music Therapy students to provide an opportunity to explore music. Music therapy is beneficial for individuals with Autism as it can improve communication skills and facilitate social interactions. Additionally, it helps regulate emotions and enhances sensory processing.

Autism101 Embracing Neurodiversity in the Workplace: Unlock the potential of neurodiversity in your workplace through this comprehensive training: "Autism 101: Embracing Neurodiversity in the Workplace." Discover the invaluable benefits of integrating individuals living with Autism into your team. The session provides insights into Autism spectrum traits, fostering an inclusive environment, and unleashing untapped talent. Equip your organization with the tools to foster an environment where every individual's potential is valued. Embrace neurodiversity and witness the positive transformation it brings to your workplace.

Skills to Pay the Bills | Cooking Module: Our Cooking session was a four-week program where participants learned about nutrition, allergies, reading labels, kitchen safety, went on a grocery store tour, and prepared meals for themselves. Teaching cooking skills and grocery navigation to individuals with Autism is crucial for fostering independence and improving daily living skills. These skills enhance their ability to make healthy food choices, promote self-sufficiency, and build confidence in managing everyday tasks.

22nd Annual Walk for Autism: The 2023 Walk for Autism was a tremendous success! This signature event played a vital role in supporting our operations and program budget, which rely entirely on fundraising dollars. Thanks to the incredible support from our community, we raised awareness and crucial funds to support individuals living with Autism. 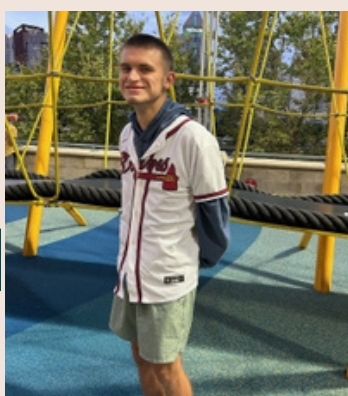

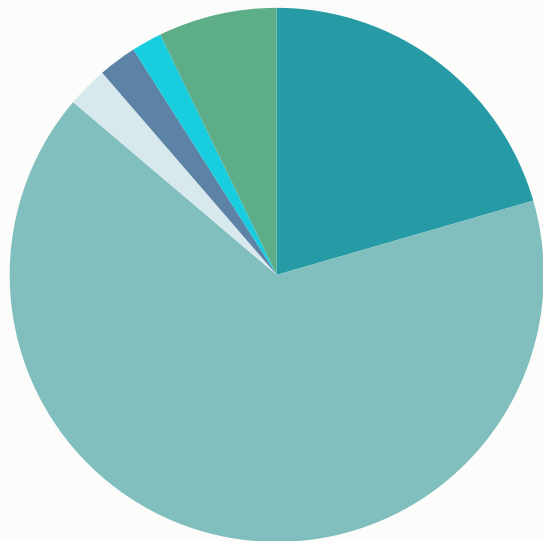

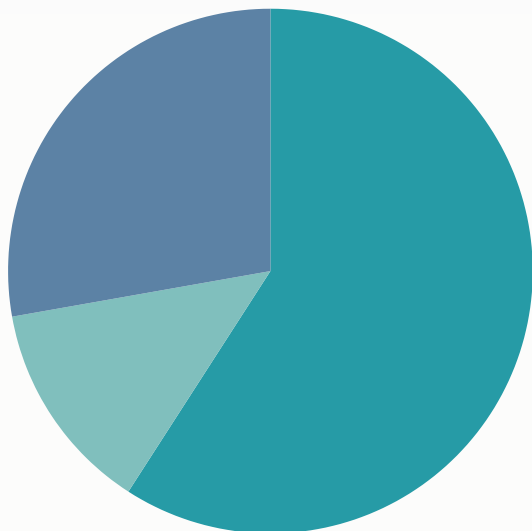
